

# CUB CHALLENGE 2019

## FAQs

### General Information

1. What is Cub Challenge 2019? Cub Challenge is the Biggest Campout for Cub Scouts and our very first and one and only Cub Scout event at the beautiful Woodruff Scout Camp, located in the North Georgia Mountains, March 15-17, 2019. Your scouts will be among thousands of other scouts from the Atlanta Council who are seeking to **Be Brave, Stay Strong and Survive**.
2. When will Cub Challenge 2019 be held? March 15th to March 17th, 2019.
3. Where will Cub Challenge 2019 be held? Woodruff Scout Camp.
4. Will there be Cub Challenge merchandise? Yes. Cub Challenge branded merchandise will be available. We encourage you to order merchandise online prior to the event.

### Unit Registration

1. Who can attend Cub Challenge 2019? Cub Challenge 2019 is open to all registered youth in Cub Scout Packs and siblings as of March 15, 2019. Scouts BSA Troops and Venturing Crews are encouraged as well for volunteer positions.
2. Can Cub Scout Packs outside of the Atlanta Area Council attend? Yes. While this event is primarily focused on AAC units, out of council units may register and attend.
3. When do I need to finalize the names of Scouts and Leaders attending? Unit leaders can register their units now and estimate the number of Youth and Leaders attending. A deposit will be needed to secure the registration. Units are asked to add names of participants as soon as possible. Participant names must be entered into the registration system by February 28, 2019.
4. What is the cost to attend Cub Challenge 2019? The cost is \$45 per Scout/Sibling and \$10 per unit leader/adult. Siblings under the age of 5 are free! **If you register before February 15, 2019, you will receive \$10 off per youth and \$5 off per Adult.**
5. What does the registration fee cover? The registration fee covers the cost of the Cub Challenge 2019 program and each participant will receive an Cub Challenge 2019 patch.

2. What type of activities will be offered? There will be a wide variety of activities during the day on Saturday. Some of the program activities include (note BB Shooting, Archery and the Ultimate Frisbee Classic will be on scheduled rotations, all others will be first come/first served):

- Brave Beam Challenge (Brave Zone) – Balance your way to Fortune and Glory by being the first to raise your flag!
- Eagle Eye Challenge (Survive Zone) - Prove your Team has what it takes to find your tools to ring the bell in the Eagle Eye Challenge!
- Monsoon Challenge (Survive Zone) - No Sleep for your group in the Monsoon Challenge! Can you raise the Flag before your Shelter floats away...
- “Escape the Woods” Ropes Course Challenge (Brave Zone) - Lead your Team to Safety by Escaping the Woods through the Ropes Course Challenge!
- Dark Path Challenge (Stay Strong Zone) - All is Lost unless you can guide your Team to find their gear in the Dark Path Challenge!
- Ultimate Frisbee Classic (Webelo, AOL and Adults) - Be Brave, Stay Strong, and Survive! Win the Ultimate Frisbee Classic!!
- Snap Shot Challenge (Stay Strong Zone)
- Pirates Treasure Challenge (Stay Strong Zone)

3. Will there be religious observances held during Cub Challenge 2019? Yes. An Interfaith Service is scheduled for 8:30 am Sunday morning at the Amphitheater.

4. Will there be a Midway at Cub Challenge 2019? Yes. There will be a midway where vendors and organizations will provide information and demonstrations of Scouting interest. The midway will run from 11 am to 2 pm in the Woodruff Dining Hall.

### Volunteers

1. Where are volunteers needed? We are expecting up to 2,000 total attendees at Cub Challenge 2019. This requires a lot of volunteers to run a safe and fun weekend. Volunteers are required in the following areas:

3. I will be attending with my unit but can volunteer for some time? Yes. We are requesting that each unit attending provide at least 1 volunteer adult to help run program activities on Saturday.

4. What is the cost for volunteers? There will be no registration charge for volunteers and each volunteer will be provided a Cub Challenge 2019 Volunteer patch and meals for the weekend. Volunteers are encouraged to purchase a volunteer t-shirt for the weekend through the volunteer registration site.

### Logistics

1. When does check in start? Check-in times will begin Friday afternoon at 4 pm in the Nunn Building and extend to 8 pm Friday evening. All units are encouraged to arrive Friday afternoon/evening.

2. Where will we park? Due to parking limitations at Woodruff, carpooling is welcomed and highly encouraged. We plan to have all vehicles parked on Woodruff property, however overflow parking may be required offsite. Prior to the weekend, parking assignments will be made and provided to the units. Shuttle bus service will also be available, if offsite parking is required. Once you receive your parking assignment/pass, please provide your name and mobile phone number on the parking pass and post it on your dashboard of your vehicle.

3. Where will we camp? Units will be assigned camp site locations prior to the event weekend. Camping will either be in established Woodruff Campsite locations or Jamboree-style in assigned spaces in open fields. There will be limited room, so we ask units to minimize their camping footprint by pitching tents closely together.

4. What are the food arrangements for Units? Units may bring and prepare their own meals, however are highly encouraged to take advantage of the prepared meal plans in the Woodruff Dining Hall. The prepared meal plan is \$25 per individual and provides meals for Friday evening, Saturday breakfast, lunch and dinner, and Sunday breakfast (meals can also be purchased on an individual meal basis).

5. Can I arrive on Saturday? Units are encouraged to arrive on Friday evening, but we anticipate some will not be able to join us until Saturday morning. If units can only attend on Saturday, that is ok and encouraged to promote as much attendance as possible for the event.
