

# Woodruff Geocaching Challenge

**This form must be turned in to the camp office by lunchtime on Friday.**

Geocaching is a worldwide game using the global positioning system (GPS). You may use either a GPS unit or cellphone to locate hidden "caches" of various sizes around camp. All the Woodruff geocaches have a form clearly identifying them as an official Woodruff geocache and a animal patrol name for that specific geocache.

**To earn The Woodruff Geocaching Challenge Award, find at least 10 of the 15 geocaches on this list.** When you find them, sign the log and record the patrol name found at the geocache. When you have documented at least ten, turn your form in at the camp office and you will receive a special Woodruff Geocaching Challenge patch. The Woodruff Geocaching Challenge Award may be earned by both Scouts and Adult Leaders.

The geocache container can be as small as an acorn or as large as a shoebox. If it contains goodies (known as swag), please only take an item if you leave something in its place. On the log record your name, date and troop. **Please place the cache back where you found it!**

There are Woodruff Challenge geocoins available for purchase in the trading post which are trackable on geocaching.com and can be registered and tracked worldwide. Just add the coin to any cache anywhere and log it on geocaching.com. If you leave it in a camp cache, it will be logged in the next public cache it is placed in.
